DILEMMA BACKGROUND



Gateway West Indicated Needs

Furniture assembly (e.g., building beds, setting up common areas),

maintenance or repair assistance

Organizational skills (to manage storage rooms, donation intake, and supply closets)

Arts and crafts instruction (trauma-informed, culturally sensitive)

Music therapy or recreational facilitation (calming environments, group sessions)

Event planning and group activity leadership (holidays, cultural celebrations)

Meal prep/distribution (following food safety guidelines)

Guest service orientation (polite, empathetic, nonjudgmental)

Data entry and spreadsheet tracking

Donation intake and inventory logging (using simple tracking forms)

Transportation coordination (scheduling or assisting EMTs/drivers)

Cultural humility and trauma-informed care awareness

Ability to work with vulnerable populations (patients with mental illness, inebriation, or complex trauma)

Reliability and discretion (volunteers may be around sensitive situations or information)

Gateway Family-tutoring needs, art facilitating, music class, sewing class, movie night volunteers, kid friendly activities, game night facilitators

Gateway West-art facilitation, mental health (meditation, wellness activities), book club, job readiness,

Gateway Center-yoga, music, art facilitation, book club, meditation, wellness activities, karaoke,

I think everyone brings a skill set with them whether that be financial literacy, knowledge of community resources, or the willingness to mentor others. The biggest skill for a volunteer is the willingness to show up to help.






