FRAMING THE NEED

Morehead-Cain Civic Collaboration Project

- **Rising Barriers:** Shifting college admissions, growing DEI opposition, and economic uncertainty are making it harder for Fellows to succeed in traditional pathways.
- **Talent Needs Support:** MKE Fellows are gifted students, but early, sustained mentorship and leadership development are essential for long-term success.
- **Urgent Opportunity:** Fellows need clearer guidance and deeper ownership of their growth to thrive in a changing landscape: now is the time to act.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Leadership – Readiness – Impact

- Over the past eight weeks, we listened to Fellows, staff, board members, and community leaders, conducting over **30 ethnographic interviews** and conducting focused research.
- From those conversations, we identified **six key opportunities** to strengthen and expand the impact of the MKE Fellows Program.
- Through targeted investments, amplifying student voices, and expanding leadership opportunities, we can help ensure every Fellow is equipped to succeed, thrive, and lead Milwaukee into the future.

MKE LEADERSHIP JOURNEY

Empowering Milwaukee's Future Leaders

We propose a three-phase journey that begins in high school, catalyzing college readiness:

Service Spring: Junior Fellows collaborate on team-based service projects, guided by local mentors, to develop initiative, teamwork, and community leadership.

Summer Institute: Fellows participate in a week-long pre-college experience focused on application readiness, identity exploration, and brotherhood.

College Planning: Fellows receive structured essay support, one-on-one advising, and access to pro-bono private college counselors to close the admissions resource gap.

PHASE 1: SERVICE SPRING

MKE STRUCTURED LEADERSHIP JOURNEY

We recommend instituting a required **community service project** as a vital part of the MKE Leadership Journey, titled **Service Spring**.

- High School Junior Spring Semester.
- Teams of six to eight MKE Fellows work with a mentor on a project of their choosing.
- Begins with a workshop series, where fellows learn from entrepreneurs & local leaders.
- Culminates in a **community showcase** celebrating their work & impact.

PHASE 2: Summer Institute

MKE STRUCTURED LEADERSHIP JOURNEY

Following Service Spring, we recommend Fellows participate in a Summer Institute before their Senior Year, aimed at addressing 3 critical MKE Pillars: **brotherhood, college preparation, & identity-building.**

- 2–3 University professor lectures per day, allowing students to experience college classes.
- Sessions for scholarship searches, compiling a college list, & drafting the Common App Essay.
- Opportunities to reflect on personal passions & identity, inspiring college essays.

PHASE 3: College Planning

MKE STRUCTURED LEADERSHIP JOURNEY

To ensure MKE Fellows are equipped to navigate this process with confidence and support, we recommend a system of **mentorship, peer collaboration, and access to high-quality advising.**

- A structured timeline of Common Application & Supplemental Essays, finishing by Early Action.
- **Peer-Review Essay Writing Sessions** would allow Fellows to support one another's journeys.
- Partnership Proposal: **Pro-Bono Private College Counseling**, Ex: Matchlighters Scholars.

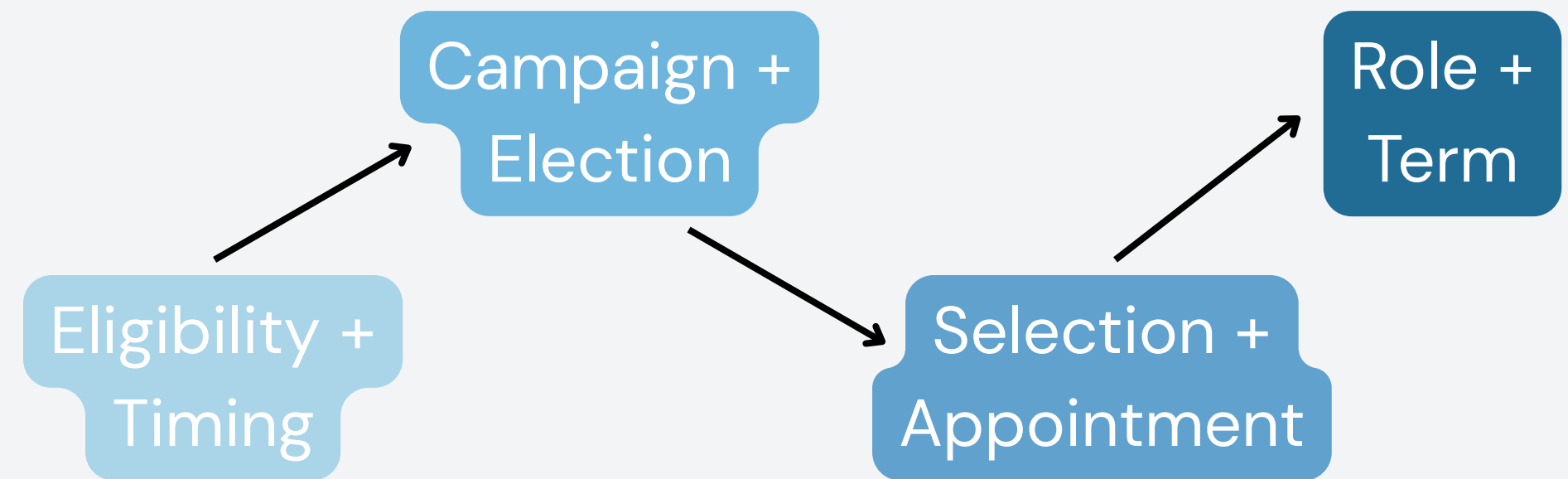

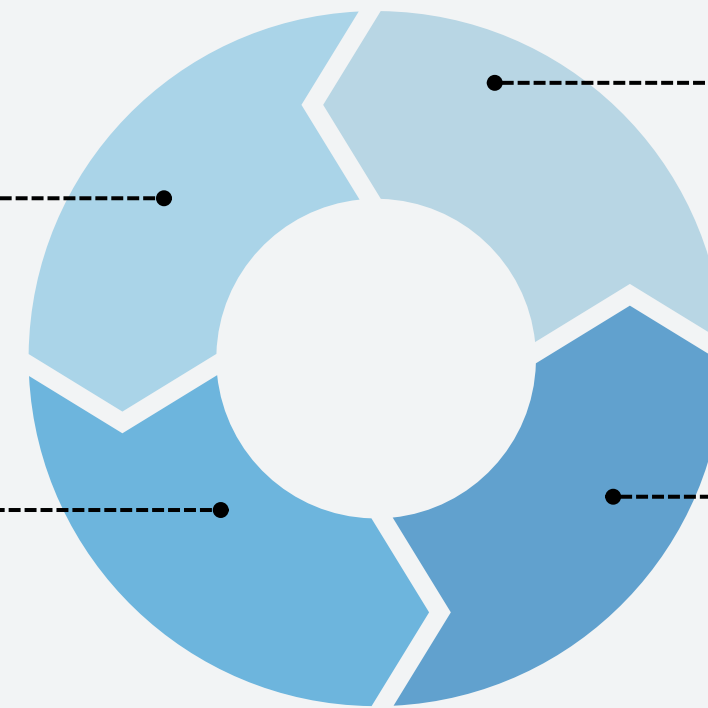

CAMPUS CONNECT

Fostering Belonging Through Peer-Led Campus Visits

What It Is:

- A peer-hosted pre-college visit program for admitted Fellows.
- Fellows stay overnight, attend classes, meet student orgs, and experience real college life.

Why It Matters:

- Official tours are often curated — this offers *real connection*.
- Builds early belonging, a key factor in college success.
- Models like the PEOPLE Program show strong results (**94% college enrollment**).

Scalable Start:

Launch with regional schools (e.g., UW–Madison, Marquette) and expand with feedback.

9TH GRADE OUTREACH

Planting the Seeds of Success

Goal:

Earlier exposure to college readiness, starting in the 9th grade

Why:

Foundational choices are made early; many students aren't aware of what's possible

How:

Bi-annual workshops, family sessions, mentor stories, engagement tracking

Impact:

Builds a college mindset, prepares students & families before junior year, grows applicant pool

FELLOWS FORWARD FUND

Investing in Milwaukee's Future Leaders

What It Is:

- A grant fund for MKE Fellows to pursue personal and professional growth.
- Inspired by enrichment models like Morehead-Cain and educator development grants.

Examples of Use:

- College visits, diversity weekends, leadership camps, conferences, enrichment travel.

Tiffany Engibous-Cameron, Chief of Staff at St. Augustine Prep, attributed much of their teachers' professional success to their "Invest in YOU" Program





FELLOWS FORWARD FUND

Investing in Milwaukee's Future Leaders

Key Features:

- Request platform modeled after an "Amazon Wish List"
- Community sponsorship opportunities
- The application includes reflection, budget, and mentor endorsement

Impact:

- Helps students say yes to life-changing opportunities
- Builds confidence, curiosity, and ownership of their journey
